various stages of manipulation

- Walking With Dinosaurs (Prod. Tim Haines, 1999, BBC)
 - Ep. 4: Giant of the Skies **Opening** protagonist / narration / epic character
 - Ep. 5: Spirits of the Ice Forest Last chapter, "image enhancement" mimicking a "real" documentary, thus exposing strategies of documentary-making
